Did You Know?

- Breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death for Native women.
- Native women have a 7% higher breast cancer rate compared to non-Hispanic white women.
- Native women have a 10% higher death rate from breast cancer compared to non-Hispanic white women.
- Native women experience high rates of hormone positive breast cancer development. Komen Tissue Bank researchers would like to know more about why the estrogen levels are so high in this group. With this knowledge, researchers may be better able to develop more treatments for Native women with breast cancer.
